My hope is that each of you feels that same sense of connection and pride in being part of this unique community.

Please be mindful that walk-ins will not be accessible during this time, and all time with her should be scheduled in advance. She will return calls during her office hours, which may vary, and schedule a time that works for both of you. Fall Cleanup

It's time to clear porches, patios and planting areas outside your apartments. Please cut back or remove any plants you may have put in the ground, dispose of dead summer plants in pots and store all planting items—such as pots, tools and accessories—inside your apartment rather than on your porch or patio. This is also a reminder to get rid of or store any furniture and decorative items inside for the winter, so contractors have easy access for snow removal, etc. If there are excessive items spotted after November 20, they may be removed at the discretion of management.

would like disposed of. Pickup
will take place on Thursday,
November 13, between
11:00 am and 1:00 pm.



Garden Cleanup

It is time to clear out your raised garden bed behind the barn.

If you have a raised garden bed in the area behind the barn, all gardens must be cleaned out by the end of day on Friday, November 14. Anything remaining after this date will be disposed of at our discretion.

Maintenance Requests

All maintenance requests must be initiated through the front desk by calling 908-221-0266 or by using the "Maintenance Requests" module on Touchtown. If you stop a staff member on the property or mention an issue in a casual conversation, it's easy for the request to be forgotten as they move on to their next task.

Heating Tips

Ridge Oak's heat turns on automatically when the outdoor temperature drops below 68°F. As colder weather arrives, follow these tips to stay warm:

- Make sure all windows and doors are closed & locked.
- Turn off all AC units. If it feels chilly:

Villages 1–11: Turn the thermostat up to 5. After 30 minutes, lower it to your comfort level.

Villages 1A, 9A, 12: Turn the thermostat higher, wait 30 minutes, then adjust as needed.

Cooking Guidance

- Always use both the range hood and ceiling exhaust fans
- Keep burners, drip pans and oven clean.
- Never leave the stove unattended while cooking.
- Use cooking oils sparingly to avoid smoke.
- Don't store items on the stove top or in the oven.
 No burner covers allowed.
